 - e. Top priorities
 - i. Peer services are vital! There is a lack of training options offered within the state due to the small number of training providers. The cost of training and certification is a financial barrier to individuals wanting to be a Peer. The ability to have more Peers is limited since the Provider needs to have outpatient license limits.
 - Workforce Development must be a priority! There is a shortage of licensed professionals and there are modifications that could be made to allow for a more diverse workforce that allows less qualified mental health workers and paraprofessionals. - follow through of candidates (ghosting), viable wage
 - iii. Reimbursement rates are not enough to pay an adequate payrate and invest into quality enhancements for the program. PA must consider other service delivery models and reimbursement models like CCBHCs.
 - iv. Regulatory reform is a no cost solution! Regulations are dated with a need to review the staffing requirements, administrative burden of documentation and encounter verification.
